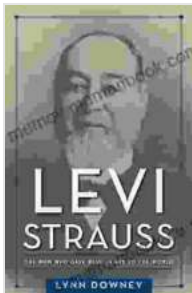


Levi Strauss: The Man Who Gave Blue Jeans To The World

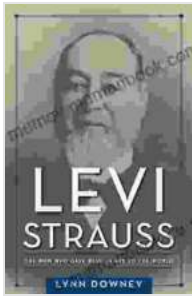

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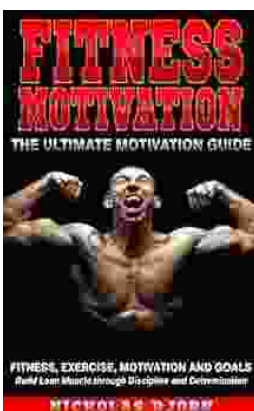
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
